RESEARCH INTERESTS	Her research interests lie mainly in the theory of punishment, the sociology of punishment, and criminal justice policy.  Several of her publications focus on the systemic interactions between the individual institutions of punishment, as well as across the spheres of legislation, sentencing, and the delivery of punishment. They analyse the direct effects, and especially the unanticipated side effects, of the fragmented and unstable Greek legal framework for punishment, which is plagued by normative contradictions and a managerialist, often populist orientation. Linked to the above is her interest for the relation between the mode of organization and the aims of penal institutions. Her relevant work draws on organization theory for the analysis of the delivery of the community service order, as well as the privatization of prisons.  Moreover, she has been systematically engaged with the analysis and critique of James Q. Wilson's work on "broken windows" and the "policy of zero tolerance" towards disorderly behaviour, and its neo-conservative underpinnings.  Central amongst her present interests is the exploration of the normative foundations of penal moderation in relation to the severity of sentences and the regime of their enforcement.
